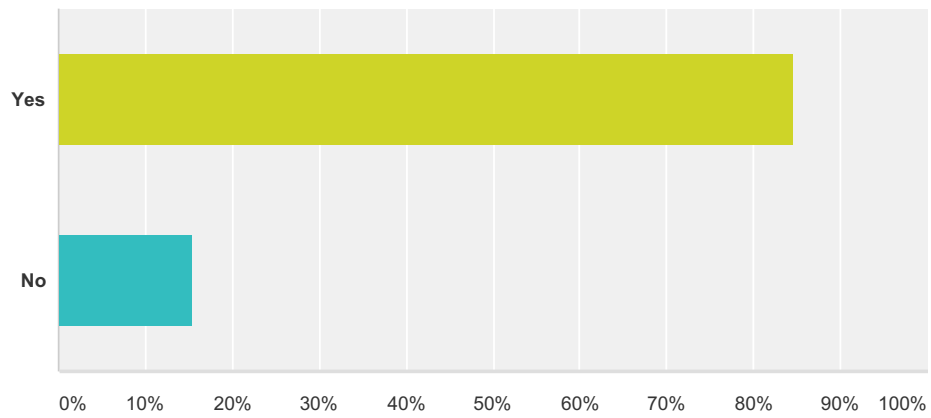


Q1 Do you feel good buildings are necessary for a good education?

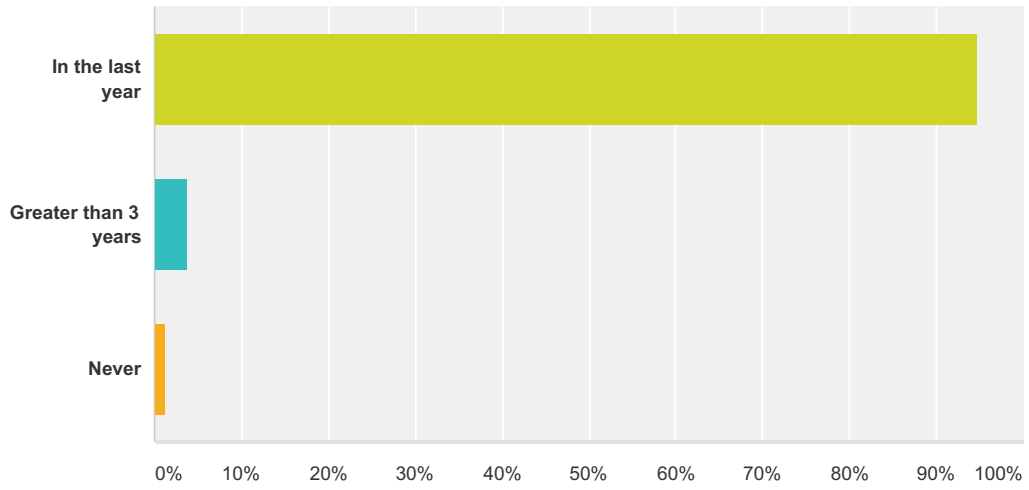

Q2 When was the last time you were in a Junction City School?

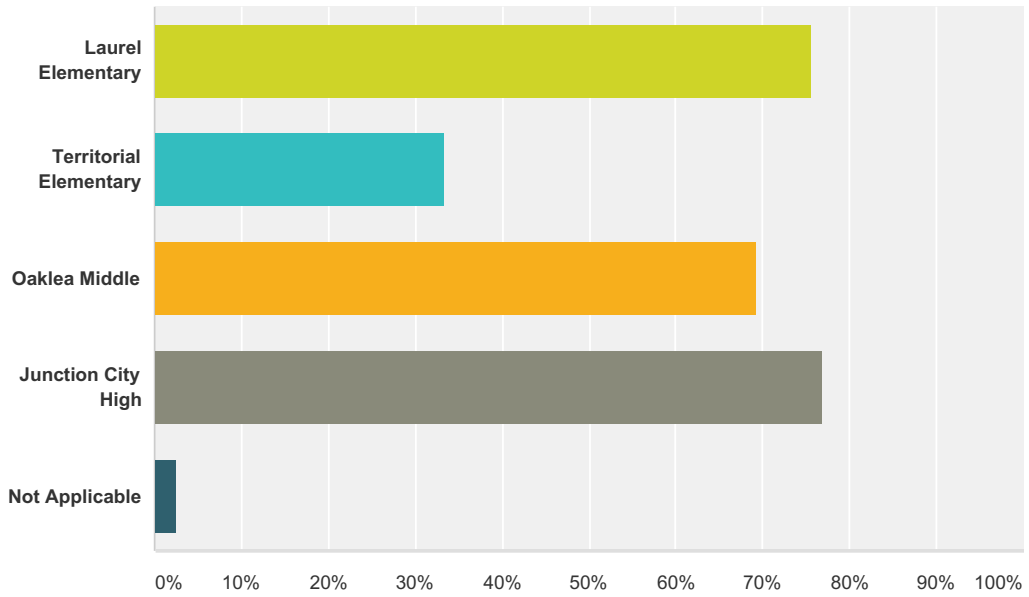

Q3 Which school(s) were you in?

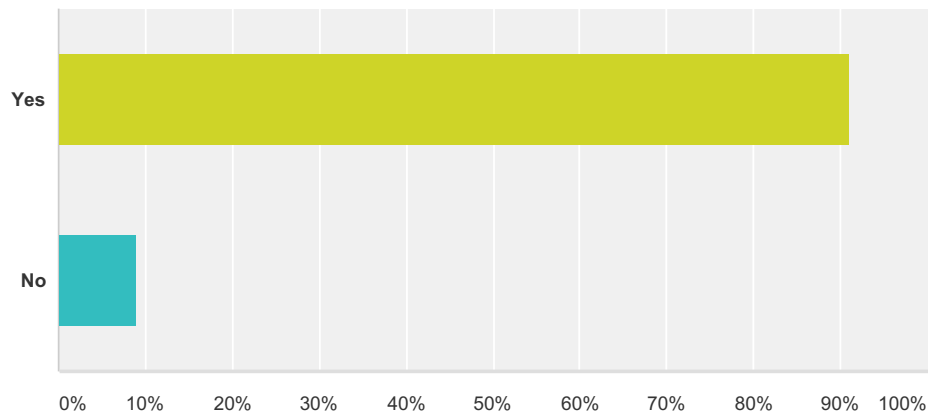

Q4 Do you feel Junction City needs better facilities?

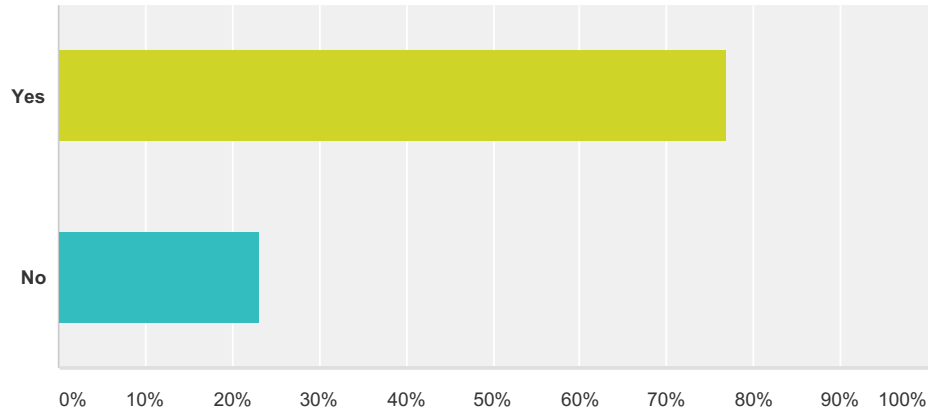

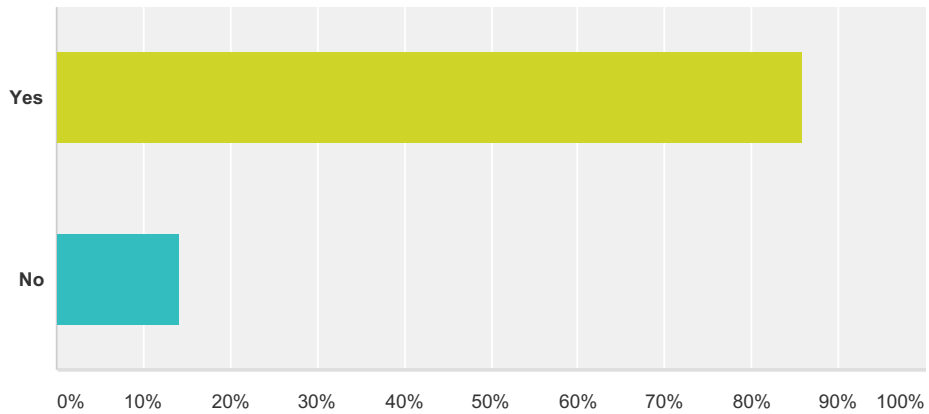

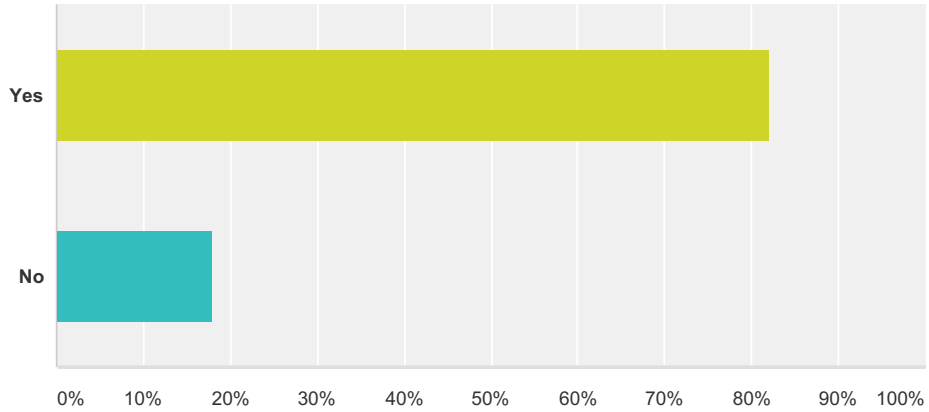

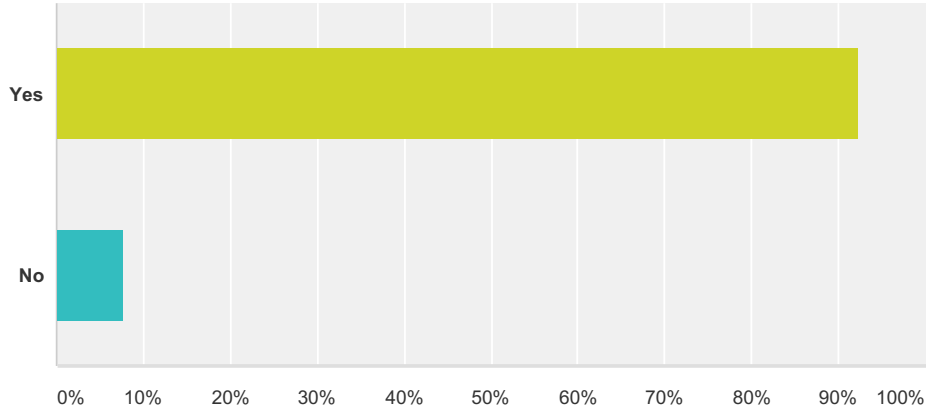
