Dear Parents and Community Members,

This annual school report card issued by the Oregon Department of Education offers a comprehensive picture of Territorial Elementary School, including information on academic indicators as well as an overview of available academic enrichment and extra-curricular activities.

For the past two school years, Territorial Elementary School students have been assessed using the new Smarter Balanced Assessments. The 2014-2015 school year, served as a baseline year, meaning we did not have like data for comparison, although we were pleased to see that the scores of Territorial students generally placed us above the state average in the areas of Science, Math and ELA in grades 3, 4 & 5. Our 2015-2016 results continue to show that higher percentages of

Territorial students met or exceed the standards measured, than is the state average in each area tested.

In addition to positive academic outcomes, Territorial Elementary School has much to offer the students and families of Junction City, including a welcoming small school environment, low student teacher ratios, and high rates of parent involvement.

Territorial Elementary School is a great place to grow, learn, and be. We recognize and celebrate the many positives and promise to continue to build on the successes, identifying ways to promote academic growth while continuing to educate and nurture the whole child.

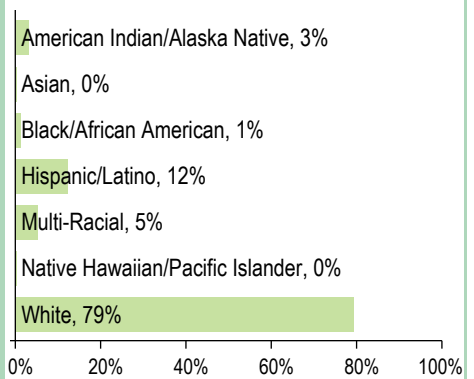

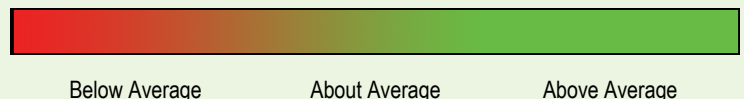
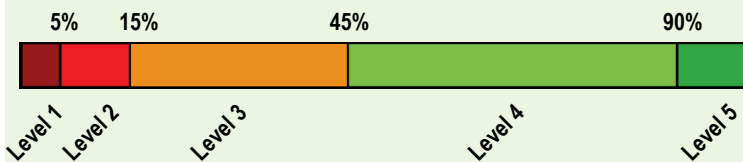
